Educational Games Expo

Each year, the U.S. Department of Education hosts the *ED Games Expo*, an in-person event to showcase educational learning games and technologies developed through programs at the US Department of Education and across the government. See here for a recap and here for a video trailer of the 2020 Expo, which occurred the week of January 6, 2020, and was headlined by more than 150 in-person education technology demonstrations by 115 teams at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington DC. At this time, it is unknown whether the 2021 Expo will occur but, if held, it is free and open to the public and parents are encouraged to bring their child(ren) to test out programs and provide feedback.
